

## STUDENT PSYCHOLOGY WORKER

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES: Participates in a psychological testing or treatment program; does related work as required.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: Under the supervision of the Chief Psychologist or Director of Training, this is a training position designed as a field work assignment for candidates for a Doctoral Degree in Psychology. An opportunity is offered the student of psychology to study and observe the use of a variety of psychological tests and the application of psychological techniques under guidance.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative Only)

Administers a variety of psychological tests, including intelligence tests, projective techniques, and various measures of aptitude and achievement;

Evaluates the results of psychological tests;

Confers with Chief Psychologist or Director of Training, to discuss test results and their implications;

Confers with Psychiatrist to discuss test findings and relate them to case histories;

Prepares reports;

Attends staff conferences and seminars.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND ATTRIBUTES: Good knowledge of the fundamental principles of psychology; good knowledge of the various types of psychological techniques; ability to administer and evaluate the results of psychological tests; good judgment in the application of psychological techniques and in reaching sound conclusions on the basis of information obtained; tact in getting patients to cooperate effectively.

MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: Graduation from a recognized college or university with a Bachelor's Degree\* and enrollment in either a Master's Degree\* program in Psychology or in a Ph.D. program in Psychology.

\*SPECIAL NOTE: Education beyond the secondary level must be from an institution recognized or accredited by the Board of Regents of the New York State Education Department as a post-secondary, degree-granting institution.
